Getting Around Town

FROM THE AIRPORT

The San Diego International Airport is a 10-minute ride from downtown. Take a cab for about \$18 or hop on the San Diego Municipal Transit System's "Airport Flyer" (Route 992) for \$2.25 (children ages 5 and under ride free).

GETTING AROUND TOWN

The San Diego Trolley light rail system stops at various points of interest around San Diego County, including Fashion Valley Mall, Qualcomm Stadium, downtown and the U.S.-Mexico border. It operates seven days a week from 5 a.m. to midnight and runs every 15 minutes.

The 15-minute ferry to Coronado departs from two locations: Broadway Pier and behind the Convention Center. Tickets are \$4.25 each way. Children ages 3 and under are free.

MTS (San Diego Metropolitan Transit System) buses are a quick way to navigate the metro area. The fare is \$2.25 per ride, but for \$5-\$7, you can buy a day pass and get unlimited bus and trolley rides.



Pedicabs are available daily on most downtown streets, particularly in the Gaslamp Quarter and along the Embarcadero.

A private car can deliver you to your destination anywhere in town with Uber or the more affordable UberX. Using their app, you can request a car and your mobile phone.



(1) Car2Go operates a fleet of blue-and-white Smart Cars that you can rent by the minute, the hour or the day. A one-time mem-San Diego bership fee of \$35 is required; after that, the cost is just 41 cents plus recently tax per minute. (Plus, street parking is free, even at a city meter.) welcomed DecoBike, the bike-sharing

Ride back in time on a restored 1946 San Diego Vintage Trolley Car that loops downtown with stops at Santa Fe Depot, Seaport Village, the Gaslamp and more.

Old Town Trolley Tours offers a guided tour with on-and-off privileges through Balboa Park, downtown and Coronado. The entertaining trolley drivers are brimming with historical facts and trivia. Group reservations are also available.

Balboa Park has a free tram that provides access to the park's museums and attractions. Park in the Inspiration Point lot and wait at Tram Central.

Another Side of San Diego Tours and Wheel Fun Rentals both offer Segway tours. You'll see major landmarks and points of interest while having way more fun than you ever would on foot.

Head up to Solana Beach, Encinitas, Carlsbad or Oceanside on the Coaster from downtown, or travel east to west in North County on the Sprinter.

> GoCar Tours, San Diego's fleet of three-wheeled minicars, is based in Little Italy. Enjoy a GPS-guided audio tour highlighting 100 city sites.






AMTRAK

San Diego keeps evolving, expanding and getting even better. Little Italy has taken off as an exciting dining destination, with more new eateries from celebrated chefs. We've also got a new music festival, a world-class horse race on the horizon and a year-long celebration at our world-famous zoo to commemorate its 100th year.

☐ LITTLE ITALY

Progressive dining and high design characterize this bustling cultural hub at the edge of downtown. Top Chef alum Richard Blais recently opened the casual, all-day chicken-and-egg eatery The Crack Shack, next to his acclaimed Juniper and Ivy. Tijuana's star chef Javier Plascencia brings innovative Mexican across the border at Bracero Cocina de Raiz, while celeb chef Brian Malarkey helms his new and highly anticipated Herb & Wood, to name just a few.

☐ STAR-STUDDED SPORTING EVENTS

San Diego welcomes the 87th MLB All-Star Game on July 12 and FanFest from July 8-11 at Petco Park, where fans can meet or watch their favorite Hall of Famers at events prior to the big game. 

San Diego kicks off the Amgen Tour of California, a Tour de France-style cycling race.

Try bacon in every possible iteration at the Bacon & Barrels Festival at Embarcadero Marina Park South, called "The Coachella of Bacon."

San Diego's hippest 'hood shows its artsy side at the North Park Festival of the Arts, with live music and dance, crafts vendors and a craft beer block.

Runners move their feet and 3-5 Runners move the street for the spectators line the street for the San Diego Rock 'n' Roll Marathon.

Downtown's Waterfront Park hosts the San Diego Festival of

the Arts, an elaborate art fair with live music, a craft beer garden and bites from local restaurants.

From the desert to the sea and everything in between, San Diego County is rich with diversity and spectacular settings. We've got beautiful beach towns and bay communities; farmlands, country villages and desert landscapes; cosmopolitan cultural centers and a bustling downtown. Come explore "America's Finest City."

Little **Italy**

Once home to San Diego's tuna industry and Italian immigrant community, an influx of high design restaurants, nightlife spots and unique boutiques have made this the city's most happening neighborhood.



DINING DESTINATIONS

Little Italy is where you'll find San Diego's hottest restaurants. Kettner Boulevard has become "Top Chef Row," since a cluster of eateries here are owned by celebrity chefs. Top Chef All-Stars winner Richard Blais brought serious culinary cred to San Diego with Juniper and Ivy, which presents some of the most creative

fare in the city-think molecular gastronomy and sous-vide meats in a vibrant setting (2228 Kettner Blvd.). Blais recently opened The Crack Shack right next door, which serves fried chicken and breakfast sandwiches all day at a casual walk-up counter. Locals pack the alloutdoor dining space, complete with bocce ball and a bustling bar scene (2266 Kettner Blvd.).

Brian Malarkey, another Top Chef alum who launched several successful local restaurants (Searsucker, Herringbone), brings rustic wood-fired pizzas, fish and meats to the neighborhood with Herb & Wood (2210 Kettner Blvd.). Anchoring the south end of Kettner is Bracero Cocina de Raíz, where star chef Javier Plascencia brings his modern Mexican cuisine across



the border and into the heart of San Diego. The street tacos and wood-grilled octopus, shrimp and bone marrow sopes are some of his greatest hits (1490 Kettner Blvd.).

Over on India Street, two-star Michelin Chef Jason McLeod serves buttery Maine lobster rolls, whole fish and oysters on the half-shell at Ironside Fish & Oyster Bar (1654 India St.). No detail was spared decking out this 1920s-era warehouse, from the wall of glittering piranha skulls to live fish tanks. For creative healthy fare, check out Café Gratitude (1980 Kettner Blvd.), which has outposts in L.A., San Francisco and Orange County. The plantbased, eclectic menu consists of dishes named for affirmations like "I Am Whole," a macrobiotic bowl of adzuki beans and veggies over brown rice or quinoa.

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FIVE COOL FINDS AT THE FARMERS' MARKET

The Little Italy Mercato, held every Saturday from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m., has everything from fresh produce and seafood to organic beauty products and local artwork.

Grab a griddled-to-order sandwich for breakfast at Seb's Panini or a large samosa stuffed with chicken tikka masala at Masala Cottage. Head to Poppa's Fresh Fish



Company to sample fresh, live sea urchin and oysters if you're feeling adventurous. For souvenirs, visit Living Air Ware for charms, magnets and even earrings decorated with live air plants that can be shipped home. **Urban Octopus** has hand-printed graphic tees, limited-edition artwork and posters.




Parking in Little Italy just got easier, with the new 10-story paid garage on Kettner Boulevard and Cedar Street. It's open evenings and weekends.

□ SHOP

The colorful Casa Artelexia transports you to Mexico with its textiles, folk art, Day of the Dead sugar skulls and paintings of Frida Kahlo (2400 Kettner Blvd.). Find handcrafted jewelry and clothing made in the U.S. and Italy at Bubbles Too (1501 India St.). A neighborhood landmark, Mona Lisa Italian Foods is stocked with fine wine, cheese, meats, and salads and sandwiches at the deli-everything you need for a picnic (2061 India St.). Architectural Salvage (2410 Kettner Blvd.) has eclectic treasures from vintage doorknobs and old keys to stained glass and garden art. On Fir Street, browse the chic boutiques in historic bungalows such as Rosamariposa (611 W. Fir St.) for tassel necklaces, cute clutches and Balinese jewels, or Vitreum (619 W. Fir St.) for botanical glass, Zen vases and fired Japanese tableware. At Love & Aesthetics (621 W. Fir St.) look for curated pieces by independents artists and a bounty of organic apothecary items, handmade pillows, candles and one-of-a-kind housewares. End your shopping spree at **iDessert** (1608 India St.) for custom sweet treats think gelato, cake, sauces, fruit and crunch toppings in flavored meringue crusts.

artists, and beachy threads at Closet Signature (875 Garnet Ave.). Nab a seat on the beachfront patio at JRDN (723 Felspar St.) and enjoy upscale surf 'n' turf among sleek surroundings.

Get caffeinated at the famed Bird Rock Coffee Roasters (5627 La Jolla Blvd.), which brews the finest coffees from around the globe, or saunter over to LJ Crafted Wines (5621 La Jolla Blvd.), a tasting room with vino straight from the barrel, top-notch cheese boards and delish tapas. The tasting is a good deal: six wines for 10 bucks. Load up on bikinis, beach hats or board shorts at Bird Rock Surf Shop (5509 La Jolla Blvd.) or rent a surfboard so you can paddle out to the local breaks. Beaumont's (5662 La *Jolla Blvd.*) is a lively spot for flatbreads, burgers, brunch and live bands Thursday through Sunday.

Best Beaches

Along San Diego's coastline, you'll find a sweet sandy spot for every desire, whether it's adventure, family fun or a slice of SoCal culture.

☐ IMPERIAL BEACH

This laid-back beach located at the southernmost point on the West Coast is a popular spot for surfing, bodyboarding and swimming. Near the Imperial Beach Pier, you'll find grassy parks, shopping and dining. In July, award-winning teams showcase one-of-a-kind sandcastles at the Sun & Sea Festival.

■ MOONLIGHT STATE BEACH

Located where Encinitas Boulevard ends by the sea, this wide, golden-sand beach is ideal for swimming, surfing, sunbathing, fishing and seaside recreation. Beachgoers have access to volleyball and tennis courts, equipment rentals, restrooms, a snack bar, a playground, fire pits and barbecues.

■ LA JOLLA SHORES

A local favorite, this beach is easily accessible (there's a large lot with free parking) and flanked by grassy Kellogg Park and a

boardwalk. Have a picnic, swim, or learn to surf in the gentle waves. In the summer and early fall, you can snorkel with the harmless leopard sharks that come in close to shore.







CORONADO CENTRAL BEACH

The stretch of sand in front of the iconic Hotel del Coronado is San Diego's most famous beach. Marilyn Monroe filmed Some Like It Hot here, and it's perfect for families, long walks and seashell collecting. At low tide, explore the tide pools in front of the hotel, and don't miss the mind-blowing sculptures created by the "Sandcastle Man."

CHILDREN'S POOL BEACH

Seals and sea lions love to hang out in this protected cove in La Jolla. Watch them swim and sunbathe on Seal Rock from the shoreline or the walkway that circles the cove, but keep your distance—it's a federal offense to disturb them.

Top Surf Spots

Whether you are a seasoned pro or just learning to pop up, San Diego is blessed with world-famous breaks for every level. Check out these beautiful beaches and their waves.

MISSION BEACH

This busy shoreline, better known for its boardwalk and people watching, is also a good place for beginners to learn how to surf. At the northern part of Mission Beach, you'll find novices paddling out on foam boards, with equipment rentals or lessons available nearby. After surfing, stroll over to the lively restaurants and bars in Belmont Park or along Mission Boulevard.

BLACK'S BEACH

A mecca for advanced surfers seeking the best waves off San Diego's coast, this iconic spot is also known as San Diego's unofficial "clothing optional" beach, so brace yourself for some birthday suit sightings. The most popular route to the beach is down the bluffs at Torrey Pines Gliderport. It's a steep climb and trails can be unsteady, so be cautious.

☐ DEL MAR

Reliable waves and good exposure to all swell directions make this sandy stretch popular with surfers of all skill levels. Multiple surf breaks stretching down the coast encourage the crowd to spread out, so you'll have space to call your own. For some of the best breaks, walk straight out to the ocean from the end of 19th, 23rd or 25th Street.

☐ CARDIFF REEF

Home to San Diego's most famous surfer, Rob Machado, Cardiff boasts longboarders, stand-up paddlers and surfers riding every kind of board made from the '60s to the present day. Check out the infamous "Cardiff Kook" statue, often dressed in costume or decorated for an occasion.







Run and Ride

With networks of paved trails, myriad green spaces and great weather year-round, San Diego is one of the best cities to explore on foot or by bike.



□ RUNNING

For a breezy bay run, start at Waterfront Park in Little Italy and head south past the Maritime Museum, the USS Midway and Ruocco Park. A great way to experience Balboa Park is an easy run along Trail No. 1, which takes you through the western lawn and right to Cabrillo Bridge. One of the most popular trails is the path to the beach at Torrev Pines State Natural Reserve. The moderate 3-mile trek rewards hikers and runners with views of sandstone canyons, groves of the rare Torrey pine and wild flowers before ending at a picturesque beach.

The city hosts several marathons and half marathons in the summer months. The landmark Coronado Bridge opens up for pedestrian access on just one day every year during The Navy's Bay Bridge Run Walk (navylifesw.com/bridgerun) on May 15. The Rock 'n' Roll Marathon (runrocknroll.com/san-diego) returns for its 19th year on June 5, with live music along the route.

Now in its 39th year, America's Finest City Half Marathon and 5K (afchalf.org) on August 21 starts at the tip of Point Loma at Cabrillo National Monument and ends in beautiful Balboa Park.



■ BICYCLING

Don't feel like packing up your bike and bringing it with you? You can easily rent one on demand after you arrive in San Diego at one of 180 DecoBike kiosks throughout the city (decobike. com), At the self-serve stations, you can get a bike for an hour or the whole day and return it to any DecoStation around town.

Pedal along the Pacific Beach Boardwalk from the Crystal Pier Hotel down to Belmont Park for a leisurely cruise that's filled with great people watching. Head over to Mission Bay for a five-mile, flat-paved road that circles Fiesta Island. Or venture to a scenic 11-mile strip of the Bayshore Bikeway from Coronado to Imperial Beach, where a separate bike path surrounds you in natural beauty.

Want to stay closer to the city? Just south of Seaport Village is Embarcadero Marina Park North, where you can enjoy views of both the bay and the downtown skyline. Cycle past yachtfilled marinas and old tiki resorts on Shelter Island in Point Loma, and then take a water break at the Yokohama Friendship Bell, a two-ton bronze bell that was a gift from the city of Yokohama, Japan.

What is the best thing about your job? I get to be creative and work with LEGO bricks every day.

What's new at LEGOLAND? Our Ninjago World and the 4D Ninjago The Ride. Guests train to be ninjas, testing their balance, agility and speed inside the temple, and then try out their skills on the ride using hand gestures to battle evil characters by throwing fire, ice, lightning and shock waves. We built 22 new LEGO models for the temple, and it's a great 4D immersive experience with heat, wind, smoke and surround sound.

What is your favorite place at LEGO-LAND? San Francisco in Miniland USA. I put together the Golden Gate Bridge, which is 10 feet long and 20 feet high. I am really proud of that.

Any insider tips for navigating the park? Just walk into the park, hang a left and follow the adventure. It's a giant loop


that progresses from younger to older kid experiences and ends up in the Imagination Zone.

☐ CALIFORNIA SEASONAL

Taste the bounty of Southern California at restaurants that take pride in using local produce, meats and cheeses. Chef Trey Foshee of George's California Modern (1250 Prospect St., La Jolla) serves exceptional seasonal California fare alongside stellar views of La Jolla Cove. The menu at **The Red Door** highlights produce grown at the owner's farm atop Mount Helix (741 W. Washington St., Mission Hills). Indulge in the six-course "Mercy of the Chef" tasting menu at Nine-Ten in the Grande Colonial Hotel (910 Prospect St., La Jolla), which creatively incorporates locally sourced ingredients and, at \$89 per person (\$134 with wine pairings), is one of the city's best fine dining values. Chef Carl Schroeder has received national acclaim for his ever-changing seasonal menus at Market Restaurant + Bar (3702 Via de la Valle, Del Mar) and Bankers Hill Bar + Restaurant (2202 Fourth Ave., Bankers Hill).

□ SEAFOOD

Top seafood restaurants in San Diego range from high-end to laid-back, but always feature the freshest fish and shellfish. The posh Water Grill impresses with its decor, iced seafood towers and raw bar selections (615 J St., Gaslamp Quarter). For alfresco dining, Oceana Coastal Kitchen at the Catamaran Resort Hotel sits right on Mission Bay, an ideal spot for king crab legs, sea bass ceviche or a seafood tower. Diners love the 800-gallon vertical jellyfish tank in the center of the dining room (3999 Mission Blvd., Mission Beach). Herringbone is a design gem with 100-year-old olive trees and twinkling lights; don't miss Top Chef Brian Malarkey's shrimp 'n' grits or whole-fish ceviche (7837 Herschel Ave., La Jolla). Point Loma Seafoods, a harborside fish market and café, bustles with happy diners because the clam chowder and breaded seafood served with house-made tartar sauce are delicious (2805 Emerson St., Point Loma).

■ WHITE TABLECLOTH ELEGANCE

For more formal dining and service, artisanal French contemporary cuisine is complemented by an award-winning wine list at Addison, the signature restaurant at Fairmont Grand Del Mar, headed by James Beard-nominated chef William Bradley. (5200 Grand Del Mar Way, Carmel Valley). Book a high-tide breakfast at The Marine Room (2000 Spindrift Drive, La Jolla) and watch waves crash against the picture windows while sipping mimosas and enjoying Grand Marnier chocolate brioche French toast. At A.R. Valentien, chef Jeff Jackson prepares the seasonal dishes for a weekly family-style dinner on the restaurant's lovely terrace overlooking Torrey Pines Golf Course (11480 N. Torrey Pines Road, La Jolla). 1500 Ocean is The Del's signature oceanfront restaurant, spotlighting California coastal cuisine. The hotel's fresh herb and vegetable gardens supply the chefs with flavorful ingredients, as do the local singleline anglers (1500 Orange Ave., Coronado).

Top Chef All-Stars season eight winner Richard Blais made his mark in San Diego with Juniper and Ivy (2228 Kettner Blvd., Little Italy), and its inventive cuisine has elevated the city's dining. Kettner Exchange (2001 Kettner Blvd., Little *Italy*) is a sleek two-story restaurant and rooftop lounge with DJs, cabanas, fire pits, craft cocktails and delish gourmet bites. Locals love the funky decor and farm-chic spin on Italian cuisine at Cucina Urbana (505 Laurel St., Bankers Hill) and the gorgeous design of The Patio on Goldfinch, with its fireplaces and huge plant wall (4020 Goldfinch St., Mission Hills). For upscale gourmet tacos and vibrant scenes, visit Galaxy Taco (2259 Avenida de la Playa, La Jolla) and Bracero Cocina de Raíz (1490 Kettner Blvd., Little Italy).





■ WALK-UP/COUNTER SERVICE

Some of the city's best eats are found at casual spots with counter service. Wow Wow Waffle is hidden behind a laundromat, but the sweet and savory Belgian street waffles and lemonade in mason jars are worth seeking out. (3519 30th St.,

North Park). Food hall

Pan Bon has plenty of options for breakfast on the go: a pastry station stocked with croissants, delectable Italian desserts and even breakfast pizza (1450 Kettner Blvd., Little Italy). For a quick but satisfying lunch, get shawarma, falafel and housemade flatbread baked in a traditional saj oven at Mama's Bakery & Deli (4237 Alabama

St., University Heights) or choose a slice from 20 different New York-style pies at Pizzeria Luigi (2121 El Cajon Blvd., North Park; 1137 25th Street, Golden Hill). Multiple incarnations of Tender Greens can be found around town, as locals love their healthier fare served fast: big salads, sandwiches, soups and hot entrees like salt-and-pepper chicken.

☐ FEELING ADVENTUROUS?

Try the exotic meat dishes at S&M Sausage and Meat, such as elk meatloaf and house-made alligator andouille (4130 Park Blvd., University Heights). Carnitas' Snack Shack is a "pork palace" that's garnered a cult following, and locals are happy to stand in line for the "triple threat" sandwich with pork loin schnitzel, pulled pork and bacon (2632 University Ave., North Park; 12873 El Camino Real, Carmel Valley). Make the trip to Flying Pig Pub & Kitchen in Vista for farm-fresh cuisine, steak butchered in-house and craft beer (230 S. Santa Fe Ave.).

San Diego proudly stands as one of the nation's craft beer capitals, home to hoppy IPAs, Belgian-style sippers and more than 120 exciting breweries. We've also got our fair share of distilleries producing small-batch handcrafted spirits, countryside vineyards and urban wineries with open doors for wine tastings and tours.



With more than 120 small craft breweries, including dozens of national and international award winners, San Diego is abuzz over its thriving and rapidly expanding craft brew scene. Here's a guide to some of the best breweries and beer pubs in town.

■ MODERN TIMES

Quirky decor, including a wall of comic books and a mural constructed with Post-it notes, is the backdrop for inventive brews on 16 taps such as Fortune Islands, a wheat beer infused with tropical aromatics, and Black House, an oatmeal coffee stout made with house-roasted beans.

☐ STONE BREWING WORLD BISTRO & GARDENS

BILLION-DOLLAR BREW

Ballast Point's sale to Constellation Brands for \$1 billion blew the minds of local suds connoisseurs and dominated headlines and gossip in San Diego last fall. Ballast Point started as Home Brew Mart in 1992 and grew to be one of the region's top-producing breweries. Known for its tasty Sculpin IPA, it also has a distillery and makes flavored vodkas, whiskey and rum. Talk about putting San Diego on the global craft beer map! ♥ ballastpoint.com

MISSION BREWERY

Housed in the historic Wonder Bread building (built in 1894) near Petco Park, this brewery sports an open layout affording views of brewmasters working their magic while patrons sample flights of ale. 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
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
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

BALBOA PARK // ART IN THE CITY





With a vast array of theaters, thought-provoking museums and compelling historical sites, San Diego's arts and culture scene is booming both with established destinations and new creativity. Summer calls for performances under the stars, picnics in the parks and strolls through the city's past. Art is everywhere; immerse yourself.



Referred to as the "Smithsonian of the West," Balboa Park is a 1200-acre urban oasis with gorgeous gardens, striking architecture, a world-famous zoo and 17 museums. Here is a sampling of not-to-miss exhibits at the park.

☐ MINGEI INTERNATIONAL MUSEUM

DJ Schoeny's favorite spot is Cake Nightclub (755 Fifth Ave.), for its good mix of music and swanky interior that evokes Marie Antoinette.




Budget

You can still live it up while visiting San Diego even without deep pockets—all it takes is a little ingenuity and research, as affordable restaurants and reasonably priced hotels abound.

For a good deal downtown, check out Comfort Inn Gaslamp (660 G St.), which is just a few blocks away from Horton Plaza and offers complimentary breakfast and access to a local health club. The DoubleTree by Hilton is within walking distance of Little Italy's farmers' market and the neighborhood's popular eateries (1646 Front St.). Want to be near SeaWorld?
